Dean's Report

Please share with your colleagues that **changes are coming to the process for campus review** of new proposals for degrees and certificates both at the undergraduate and graduate and professional levels. The preproposal step will be modified to obtain more information on enrollment goals as well as market potential. Approval by campus leadership will come at the preproposal stage prior to submission of a full proposal to the GAC or UAC. Changes to this process are impacting the review of new proposals, so expect some delays. Please let Dr. Blum know of any proposals for new degrees and certificates that you are working on that have gone through the pre-proposal process but not the GAC. We want to ensure we do all possible to support schools during this transition. The campus will also begin to ask schools to look carefully at existing degrees and certificates for enrollment and degree completion. The goal is to consider sunsetting degrees/certificates which are no longer garnering student interest.

April 15th is our deadline for graduate student decisions on admission decisions tied to fellowships and awards. Our campus follows the practice set forth by the Council of Graduate Schools that students being offered fellowships or awards for graduate training have until April 15th, 2024, to notify a graduate program of their acceptance or decline admission and any financial awards. Latest enrollment trends (see attached) for graduate and professional programs are attached. Contact Dr. Blum if you need guidance in using the Institutional Analytics IRDS website to access more detailed information for your school and programs.

The Office of International Affairs has offered **recommendations to update our process for English proficiency testing**. The proposal is up for discussion and consideration at the GAC meeting in March 2024. Currently international students taking 100% online courses and who cannot come to campus, have fewer options to enroll in the campus English for Academic Purposed (EAP) courses G513 and G520. The class G513 is offered online in summer typically, and G520, which focuses on spoken language is only offered in person. These courses are strongly recommended for international graduate and professional students who may be teaching. The recommendation by OIA suggests schools or departments consider setting a higher level of English proficiency for international applicants in fully online programs. The English Department which oversees the EAP courses, has indicated if there is sufficient enrollment (more than 10 students in a semester) – then the course G520 could potentially be offered online. Currently about 15 students enroll in G513 in summer I, and about 10 students enroll in G520 per semester. G513 is also offered online. Please look at the document on this topic.

We have asked the Career and Counseling Services team to add graduate and professional students to their first destination survey this spring. This used to be a standard process, but in recent years only undergraduate students were surveyed about a year after degree completion. We will share the results with schools later this year.

Stellic is coming... is your program ready?

<u>Stellic</u> will provide a personalized, data-informed web-based experience for <u>all</u> IU students. Students will be able to build their degree plan within the system, register for classes, track their progress, and visualize the impact of any future decisions. They can even perform a "what if" analysis to explore adding a minor, pursuing a certificate, or even changing their major.

This summer graduate and professional programs will be asked for the most up-to-date and accurate program plan of study that shows the curriculum and outlines other degree requirements needed for an automated degree audit. <u>These degree audit materials should have 1</u>) <u>been approved by all governing bodies</u>, and 2) will be coded into Stellic to create the foundation of the student's experience <u>described above</u>.

The Graduate School will host a workshop this semester that will help you prepare for this <u>launch</u>. In the meantime, here are a few steps you can take to make sure you are ready:

- Review your current bulletin entry to ensure that ALL your **current** degree requirements are listed accurately.
 - o Graduate School programs click here
 - Independent / professional programs click <u>here</u>
- Have your most up-to-date degree requirements been approved by the Graduate Affairs Committee (GAC), and other required governing bodies?
 - No? Then you must submit a program change proposal to the GAC for review and approval ASAP. Visit <u>https://graduate.iupui.edu/faculty-staff/curriculum-</u> programs/propose/changes.html for more information.
 - Yes? Now you need to ensure your bulletin entry matches what has been approved by the GAC.
 - Don't know? Contact <u>Dezra Despain</u> to find out!
- Need to make Bulletin updates?
 - Graduate School bulletin contact <u>Dezra Despain</u>
 - IU Indianapolis bulletin contact your school's bulletin representative don't know who that is? Then, contact <u>Brian Parkison</u> (the 24-25 bulletin will be published April 1st!)
- Now that everyone is on the same page, use your most up-to-date curriculum and program requirements to do a degree audit of a student in your program who plans to graduate in May. This will help you identify any gaps that may exist, and ensure you are ready to hand over this material to the Stellic degree audit coding team!
