Preparing Future Faculty & Professionals (PFFP)

- Develop the acumen and skills needed for success in an academic position or nonacademic position in industry, business, non-profit, or government
- Learn about the full range of career options, responsibilities and mentoring in academic and non-academic careers through year round programming, including the annual fall "Pathways" conference.

Writing Group

The Graduate Mentoring Center
